Why we're contacting you

We accepted your renewal application for your preparer tax identification number (PTIN). **Your PTIN is P00646638.**

What you need to know

Your PTIN is **valid for the 2026 calendar year**. You must use your PTIN on any federal tax return or claim for refund you prepare, or substantially help to prepare, for compensation.

You must renew your PTIN by December 31 each year to prepare federal tax returns or claims for refund the following year. The annual renewal period begins mid-October and ends on December 31. Keep your PTIN information current by updating your PTIN account any time your information changes. Simply login to your online account at **IRS.gov/ptin** to update your information quickly.

Soon, you'll no longer be able to sign in to the Tax Professional PTIN System with a User ID and Password. If you have a Social Security number (SSN), you must use an ID.me account, and later this year you'll also be able to use a Login.gov account. Without one of these accounts, you will not be able to access the PTIN system. Tax preparers who do not have a SSN will continue using their current sign-in process.



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The **PTIN fee is non-refundable**. If we can't process your payment, your PTIN will be placed in a suspended status. You're responsible for submitting the proper payment to ensure your PTIN remains valid.
